

## **Evaluating Member Engagement**

Evaluating the level of Member engagement in your Chapter can help to determine if Chapter morale is high or low. If most Chapter Members are highly engaged in various aspects of your Chapter, it's fair to say that Chapter morale is high. If they're not, it's likely that Chapter morale is low. Use this checklist to evalute Member engagement, and then check out available resources on Chapter morale.

How many Chapter Members are eager to participate in Chapter events, as well as campus-wide events as representatives of Phi Sigma Pi?			
How many Chapter Members contribute to the process of setting goals and strategically planning for the future of the Chapter?			
How many Chapter Members are excited about recruiting new Members to join the Chapter and eagerly participate in tabling, flyering, etc.?			
How many Chapter Members are willing to serve as mentors to help Initiates and new Members get acquainted with being part of the Chapter?			
How many Chapter Members express an interest in taking on a leadership role when it is time to elect new Officers and Chairs?			
How many Chapter Members pursue opportunities to participate in National programs and events like Leadership in Action, Leadership Academy and National Convention?
