Remember to list the Modules you've completed based on relevance to the position you are applying for.



How to list Certificate on a resume:

Every resume is different but there is a regularly accepted format for listing certificates on your resume. Here are the steps you can follow to list your certifications efficiently:

- 1. List the certificate's title
- 2. Include the name of the host organization
- 3. List the date earned
- 4. Provide details on the associated skills

• Professional and personal leadership development certificate program. Relevant skills crafted: communication, time management, strategic planning and conflict management

- Successful Feedback-Giving Constructive Feedback: Constructed a way to give effective feedback

Listing Specialization Completed Example:

Leadership in Action, Phi Sigma Pi National Honor Fraternity - September 2022

• Communication Specialization: Provided the professional communication skills of identifying communications style to better relate to others, active listening, public speaking and presentation, trust and verbal/non-verbal communication
