

Compliance with the National Office and the IRS

As a Chapter of Phi Sigma Pi, you are a non-profit organization all your own. This means that your Chapter has financial reporting responsibility to the National Office and to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

Compliance with the National Office

If your Chapter submitted an annual budget via the Chapter Admin Portal (CAP), you are compliant with the National Office requirements for this year.

Compliance with Internal Revenue Service (IRS)

Your Chapter should have its own EIN/TIN (Tax Identification Number), as the National Office's EIN/TIN does not umbrella to Collegiate Chapters. This is because each local Chapter is an unincorporated association that is a separate and distinct entity from Phi Sigma Pi National Honor Fraternity, Inc. This is why Chapter checking accounts should read, for example, "Alpha Nu Chapter of Phi Sigma Pi."

Mark your calendar and make sure to include the annual 990-N e-postcard filing deadline in your transition materials!

Check out the Tax Exempt Organization Search

If your Chapter is not already recognized as tax exempt, you can call Customer Account Services (877-829-5500) to ask that the organization be set up to file Form 990-N.

Ready to file your 990-N e-postcard? You'll need an IRS account and the following:

- EIN/TIN
- Tax year
- Chapter's legal name and mailing address
- Any other names the organization uses
- Name and address of a principal officer
- Website address, if the Chapter has one
- Confirmation that the organization's annual gross receipts are \$50,000 or less
