Initiate Pin

Each Initiate should wear the Initiate Pin they receive at Pinning throughout the Initiation Program



Shingle

Following Induction, each Member will receive a Shingle as certification of membership into Phi Sigma Pi



Membership Pin

At Induction, an Initiate will trade their Initiate Pin for a Membership Pin as they become a new Member

The Initiate Pin you received at the Pinning Ceremony, is a symbol of the commitment you have made to the Initiation Program and our commitment to provide you the guidance and support needed to help you become a Member.

After you have participated in The Ritual Induction Ceremony, you will receive the Membership Pin and the Shingle as confirmation that you are a lifelong Member of Phi Sigma Pi.

The Ritual

Phi Sigma Pi's Induction Ceremony is:

- more than a ceremony to induct new Members
- the only means by which an individual may become a Member
- a common experience shared and cherished by all Members
- a reminder of the commitment made to Phi Sigma Pi

Subrosa

- Latin for "under the rose"
- Secrecy for the sake of integrity, honor and trust within the Fraternity
- Everyone is responsible for upholding Subrosa and subject to consequences if broken
- Applies to the following events and activities:
 - > The Ritual
 - > Chapter Meetings
 - > Voting
 - > Elections



o The Ritual

Participation in The Ritual will be one of the most significant experiences you have as a Member of Phi Sigma Pi.

During The Ritual, All Members and Initiates are expected to behave in a way that reflects the reverence with which the ceremony should be regarded and the shared experience of participating Initiates.

o Subrosa

The rose is an ancient symbol of secrecy.

Subrosa protects our rights as Brothers to make decisions, to agree or disagree, to debate and to ultimately decide the future of the Fraternity.

National Structure

Grand Chapter

- Supreme legislative body
- One Delegate from each Chapter
- Conducts business, discusses issues facing the organization and elects next council

National Council

- Supreme executive and administrative body
- 8 volunteers elected every 2 years
- Charged with enforcing the National Constitution and leading the Fraternity through strategic planning

National Staff

- Full-time professionals to assist in the day to day affairs of the Fraternity
- Located at our National Headquarters in Lancaster, PA

The Phi Sigma Pi Foundation has its own Constitution, Bylaws, and Board of Directors.

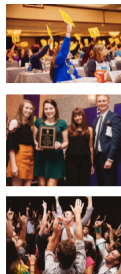
○ Leadership in Action

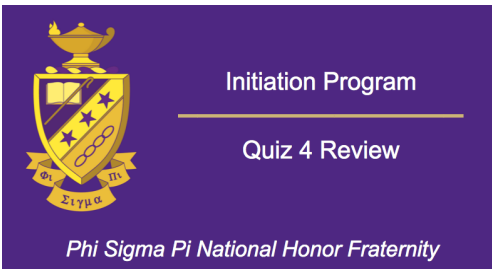

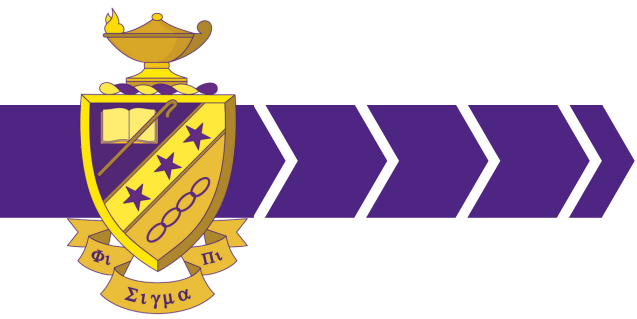

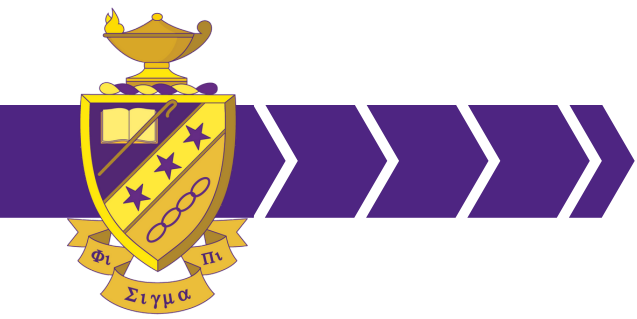
